WEST CHESTER – Last night, members of the Republican Committee of Chester County (RCCC) met at Peirce Middle School for the purposes of endorsing candidates for the 2019 elections.

The RCCC voted unanimously to endorse the following candidates:

In the race for **Chester County Sheriff, Jim Fitzgerald** received the endorsement with 222 votes on the first ballot.

For the first position of **Chester County Court of Common Pleas Judge, Andrea Cardamone** was endorsed on the third ballot with a total of 222 votes.

In the second position for **Chester County Court of Common Pleas Judge, Chuck Gaza** was endorsed on the second ballot with a total of 196 votes.

“I am proud of the Republican Committee of Chester County’s endorsements. Our candidates represent diverse interests and bring a wealth of experience to county government”, said Chester County Republican Committee Chairman Rick Loughery. “Chester County is the best place to live, work, raise a family, and retire, and this is not accidental. With 326 members present in person or by proxy, candidates needed 60% of the vote (196 votes) to receive the endorsement of the RCCC.
